The Primary Care Model for Wales (PCMW) and Accelerated Cluster Development (ACD) Programme monitoring and evaluation plan sets out how the transformation ambitions of the programme will provide assurance of progress, share learning, and support joining up of local and regional plans. The Cluster Planning Support Portal indexes resources from across the system in Wales that might assist in producing and refreshing cluster / pan-cluster planning group (PCGP) annual plans. The <u>portal</u> is structured to reflect the key elements of the planning cycle, providing an overview of considerations / methodologies for assessment and response to local needs, linking to sources of further information, and supporting skills development.
