Healthy Days at Home 'Plan on a Page'



Why is the project needed?

There is a need for a population based quality measure that works across health and care systems in Wales. Healthy Days at Home (HDAH) is a population-based quality measure with substantial market-level variation. Click here for more information. The tool can provide a single way of measuring/comparing health and care systems across Wales and can also be adapted to reflect local priorities.

The tool has already been validated in the US. The intention now is to use the principles and mechanisms to tailor it to the Welsh NHS and health care environment.

This work was highlighted as a Ministerial priority pre-Covid and now requires progressing, especially as the data may be particularly relevant in a post-Covid landscape.

Health Boards can adopt a Wales-specific version of the Healthy Days at Home tool and work with Regional Partnership Boards to explore how the data can be used in a meaningful way to inform how patients can be safely kept at home; reducing the pressure on the unscheduled care system via a patient focussed, whole-system approach to providing sustainable care.

What is the scope of the project?

- To adapt an existing tool to the Welsh context.
- To pilot data capture and analysis.
- To roll out tool to the remaining Health Boards.
- Devise a national reporting mechanism.
