Diagnosing Advanced Dementia in Care Homes

Context and Aims

About 70% of the 23,000 care home residents in Wales are living with dementia. Many of these people remain undiagnosed, impacting on their opportunity to receive care and support aligned to the **Wales Dementia Pathway of Standards** (2021).

Building on award-winning **Diagnosing Advanced Dementia Mandate (DiADeM)** work by Yorkshire and the Humber Dementia Clinical Network, the roll-out of DiADeM Cymru sets out to address this.

What is DiADeM?

DiADeM is a tool to support a range of skilled clinicians in diagnosing people with well-established dementia in a care home setting.

With the right training, support and supervision, it greatly increases the likelihood of diagnosis for well-established dementia which has not previously been diagnosed.

Opportunity

DiADeM training is available for medics, associate physicians, nurses, allied health professionals, or other practitioners who work with people living with dementia and connect with or work in a care home.
